After Effects

After Effects is a program in the adobe suite to create motion graphics & video.

What's the difference between AE & PP?

After Effects: is a video *compositing* program. Combines different visual elements into a single project or video.

Premiere Pro: is a video <u>editing</u> program. This is the program to use when editing video footage for a movie, adding transitions & effects to video footage, etc.

When creating a movie, you would use the two programs together. Premiere would edit the raw footage, you would use After Effects to add additional effects, sound to it, or to create a graphic title sequence.

To help us learn **After Effects**, we will be using our Illustrator WPAP project & animating it.
